THE SHIP REPAIRS AND DOCKING EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1940.

GALWAY, Governor-General.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 14th day of February, 1940.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Ship Repairs and Docking Emergency Regulations 1940.
 - 2. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,—
 - "Ship" has the meaning assigned to it by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908:
 - "Minister" means the Minister of Marine:
 - "Secretary" means the Secretary for Marine and includes any person acting by or under his direction.
- 3. Subject to the next succeeding regulation, no person whose business or part of whose business is the repair, alteration, or dry-docking of ships shall carry out, or cause or permit to be carried out in New Zealand on his behalf, repairs or alterations to or the dry-docking of any ship otherwise than pursuant to a contract made by such person with His Majesty's Government in New Zealand, except under the authority of a permit in writing granted by the Minister.
- 4. It shall be in the absolute discretion of the Minister to grant or refuse any permit.
- 5. The Minister may delegate to the Secretary all or any of the powers conferred by these regulations.
- 6. The Minister may at any time, and from time to time by writing under his hand, grant exemption from the requirements of these regulations in respect of any ship or class of ships, and may in like manner withdraw any such exemption.

- 7. Application for the grant of any such permit shall be made in writing by the owner, master, or agent of the ship to the Superintendent of Mercantile Marine at the port at which the work is to be carried out, and shall specify generally the nature of such work, the estimated cost thereof, and the time the work is expected to take.
- 8. Before granting a permit the Minister may require the applicant to supply such further information as in any case he may think relevant.
