THE SCRAP RUBBER CONTROL NOTICE 1942

PURSUANT to the powers vested in him by the Supply Control Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Minister of Supply and Munitions doth hereby give notice and direct as follows:—

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Scrap Rubber Control Notice 1942.
- 2. This notice shall come into force on the day following the day of notification hereof in the Gazette.
- 3. In this notice the term "scrap rubber" includes all scrap rubber, rubber scrap, disused motor-vehicle tires and tubes, and all other articles of whatsoever nature made substantially or principally of rubber but no longer in use or reserved for use for a purpose for which they were intended, not being articles the rubber content of which is in the form of vulcanite.
- 4. No person shall use any motor-vehicle tire or tube or any other article whatsoever made substantially or principally of rubber except for a purpose for which it was intended.
- 5. No person shall burn or otherwise destroy or abandon any scrap rubber.
- 6. No person shall dispose of any scrap rubber otherwise than by the delivery thereof to the Minister of Supply and Munitions or to some person authorized by the Minister of Supply and Munitions to accept delivery thereof on his behalf.
