THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Samoa Act 1921 and the Royal Powers Act 1953, Her Majesty the Queen, acting by and with the advice and consent of Her Executive Council, is pleased to make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Samoa Reserved Enactments Regulations 1954.

2. In addition to the enactments referred to in section 9 of the Samoa Amendment Act 1947, the enactments referred to in the Schedule hereto shall, to the extent therein specified, be deemed to be reserved enactments for the purposes of the said section 9.

3. A reference in the Schedule hereto to any enactment shall be deemed to be a reference to the same as amended from time to time.

4. The Samoa Reserved Enactments Regulations 1948* are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*]

Section 9 of the Samoa Amendment Act 1947 provides that the Legislative Assembly of Western Samoa may not by any Ordinance make any provision that is repugnant to a reserved enactment, and includes among the list of reserved enactments any enactment declared by any Act or regulations to be a reserved enactment for the purpose of section 9.

The Samoa Reserved Enactments Regulations 1948 specify certain Acts and regulations to be reserved enactments for the purposes of section 9. These regulations replace those regulations, and bring the list of the reserved enactments up to date by omitting certain Acts which have since been repealed and replaced by Acts which themselves contain provisions declaring them to be reserved enactments, and also by omitting certain regulations which have now been revoked and not replaced.

The regulations do not add any further Acts or regulations to the list of reserved enactments.
