THE SAWMILL REGISTRATION REGULATIONS 1952, AMENDMENT NO. 3

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Forests Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Sawmill Registration Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Sawmill Registration Regulations 1952* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1976.
- 2. Interpretation—Regulation 2 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the definition of the term "board foot".
- 3. Notice of change of ownership of sawmill—Regulation 19 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "board feet", and substituting the words "cubic metres sawn".
- 4. Form of application—(1) The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking Form No. 1 (as substituted by regulation 4 of the Sawmill Registration Regulations, Amendment No. 2), and substituting the new form No. 1 set out in the Schedule hereto.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Sawmill Registration Regulations 1952 to give effect to the change to metric measurements.
