REGULATIONS 1973, AMENDMENT NO. 4**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 8th day of August 1983

THE RIGHT HON. D. MACINTYRE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Secondary School Academic Bursaries Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Secondary School Academic Bursaries Regulations 1973* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. No further new bursaries to be awarded under principal regulations—(1) Notwithstanding anything in the principal regulations, but subject to subclauses (2) and (3) of this regulation, no bursary shall, after the commencement of these regulations, be awarded under the principal regulations.

(2) A bursary may be awarded under regulation 7 of the principal regulations to a pupil who already holds a bursary under those regulations.

- (3) A bursary under the principal regulations may be awarded to any pupil if—
- (a) That pupil was awarded such a bursary before the commencement of these regulations; and
 - (b) Subsequently (whether before or after that commencement) the award of that bursary was terminated under regulation 16 of the principal regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Secondary School Academic Bursary Regulations so that no new bursaries may be awarded under those regulations. The amendment does not affect bursaries already awarded; nor does it prevent the award of further bursaries to persons who already hold bursaries, or who formerly held bursaries whose award was terminated.
