**THE SECONDARY SCHOOL ACADEMIC BURSARIES  
REGULATIONS 1973, AMENDMENT NO. 3**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 17th day of July 1978

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Secondary School Academic Bursaries Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Secondary School Academic Bursaries Regulations 1973\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Value of bursary**—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by repealing regulation 4, and substituting the following regulation:

"4. Subject to these regulations, a bursary shall be paid at the rate of \$200 per term:

"Provided that the holder of a bursary shall so be paid that he receives no more than \$567 in respect of the year 1978."

(2) The Secondary School Academic Bursaries Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 2 are hereby consequentially revoked.

**3. Payment of bursaries**—Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3), and substituting the following subclauses:

“(3) Subject to subclauses (3A) and (4) of this regulation, the amount otherwise payable to the holder of a bursary during any term shall be reduced by 1.5 percent of that amount for every school day during that term on which the holder was absent from school.

“(3A) For the purpose of calculating the number of days during any term in respect of which the amount of a bursary is to be reduced, account shall be taken of neither—

“(a) The first 20 school days of absence during that term in respect of which the Director-General is satisfied, on the advice of the Principal of the school, that the holder was absent on account of sickness; nor,

“(b) The first 5 school days of absence during that term in respect of which the Director-General is satisfied, on the advice of the Principal of the school, that the holder’s absence due to some other reasonable cause.”

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations increase the annual value of bursaries granted under the Secondary School Academic Bursaries Regulations 1973 from \$500 to \$600, as from the second term of 1978.
