



**THE SOCIAL SECURITY (RURAL AREA) NOTICE 1969,
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

PURSUANT to section 94A of the Social Security Act 1964, the Minister of Health hereby gives the following notice.

—

NOTICE

1. (1) This notice may be cited as the Social Security (Rural Area) Notice 1969, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Social Security (Rural Area) Notice 1969* (hereinafter referred to as the principal notice).

(2) This notice shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October 1969.

2. Clause 3 of the principal notice is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting from paragraph (g) the words “or the borough of Wairoa”;
- (b) By omitting from paragraph (1) the words “Plimmerton-Paremata”;
- (c) By omitting from paragraph (n) the words “boroughs of Greymouth or Westport”, and substituting the words “borough of Greymouth”.
- (d) By omitting from paragraph (o) the word “Lyttelton,”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice amends the principal notice by providing that the boroughs of Wairoa, Westport, and Lyttelton, and the county town of Plimmerton-Paremata, are to be rural areas for the purpose of the payment of rural practice bonuses to medical practitioners.

The notice is deemed to have come into force on 1 October 1969, being the date on which the principal notice came into force.
