THE SOCIAL SECURITY (MONETARY BENEFITS) REGULATIONS 1939, AMENDMENT NO. 3

Pursuant to the Social Security Act 1938, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Social Security (Monetary Benefits) Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Social Security (Monetary Benefits) Regulations 1939* (hereinafter referred to $a_{\rm S}$ the principal regulations).

2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 6 (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Social Security (Monetary Benefits) Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 2), and sub-

stituting the following regulation:

"6. Any declaration that may be required for the purposes of Part II of the Act, or these regulations, may be made before any member of Parliament, Justice of the Peace, solicitor, Notary Public, Registrar or Deputy Registrar of a Magistrate's Court, Registrar or Deputy Registrar of Births and Deaths, constable, minister of religion, or member of the New Zealand Society of Accountants, or before any of the Commissioners, or any Registrar, or any Postmaster, or before any other officer of the Social Security Department or of the Post Office approved for the purpose by the Commission."

(2) The Social Security (Monetary Benefits) Regulations 1939,

Amendment No. 2, are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The effect of these regulations is to include among the persons who may take statutory declarations for the purposes of Part II of the principal Act and of the principal regulations Deputy Registrars of Magistrates' Courts and Registrars and Deputy Registrars of Births and Marriages.
