## THE SOCIAL SECURITY (MEDICAL BENEFITS) REGULATIONS 1941, AMENDMENT NO. 2

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Social Security Act, 1938, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Security (Medical Benefits) Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Social Security (Medical Benefits) Regulations 1941\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1950.
- 2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking clauses 28, 28A, and 29, and substituting the following clause:—
- "28. In addition to the capitation fees payable in accordance with the foregoing provisions of these regulations, medical practitioners who undertake to provide medical benefits shall be entitled to receive from the Social Security Fund mileage fees under section 5 of the Social Security Amendment Act, 1941, as if the medical benefits so provided were general medical services within the meaning of that Act, and all the provisions of that Act and of any regulations made for the purposes of that Act, in so far as they relate to mileage fees, shall apply accordingly."
- (2) The Schedule to the principal regulations, and clauses 3 and 4 of the Social Security (Medical Benefits) Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 1, are hereby consequentially revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations provide that medical practitioners providing medical benefits under the capitation system are to receive the same mileage fees as if they were providing general medical services under the fee for service system.
