### THE SECONDARY SCHOOLS BURSARIES REGULATIONS 1943, AMENDMENT NO. 1

THE HON. D. G. SULLIVAN PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the powers conferred on him by the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Secondary Schools Bursaries Regulations 1943, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Secondary Schools Bursaries Regulations 1943\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. (1) Regulation 9 of the principal regulations is hereby amended as follows:-
  - (a) By omitting from subclause (1) the words "at any private
  - school or "; and

    (b) By omitting the word "or " before the words "district high school" in subclause (2), and by inserting after those words the words "or private secondary school".
- (2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in Regulation 4 of the principal regulations, applications for bursaries to be held at any private secondary school in the year 1944 may be received by the Director on or before the 1st day of June, 1944.
- (3) The provisions of subclause (2) of Regulation 11 of the principal regulations (relating to free places for the holders of bursaries) shall not apply with respect to the holders of bursaries held at any private secondary school.
