

THE SECONDARY SCHOOLS BURSARIES REGULATIONS 1943, AMENDMENT NO. 5

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Secondary Schools Bursaries Regulations 1943, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Secondary Schools Bursaries Regulations 1943* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Maximum value of bursary—(1) Regulation 11 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 of the Secondary Schools Bursaries Regulations 1943, Amendment No. 3, and section 7 of the Decimal Currency Act 1964) is hereby further amended by omitting from subclause (1) the expression "\$100", and substituting the expression "\$300".
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (1) of this regulation, the maximum value of each secondary school bursary payable in the year 1972 shall be \$234.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the maximum value of secondary school bursaries from \$100 to \$234 for the year 1972, and thereafter to \$300.
