PURSUANT to the Social Security Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Security (Physiotherapy Benefits) Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Social Security (Physiotherapy Benefits) Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Interpretation—Regulation 2 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 2 of the Social Security (Physiotherapy Benefits) Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1, is hereby further amended by omitting from the definition of the term “group”, the word “ten”, and substituting the word “fifteen”.

3. Revocations—The following regulations are hereby revoked:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase to 15 the maximum size of physiotherapy groups, and remove the limit on private fees which physiotherapists may charge patients.
