

# THE SOCIAL SECURITY (PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS) REGULATIONS 1965, AMENDMENT NO. 4

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 11th day of March 1985

THE HON. G. W. R. PALMER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Social Security Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Security (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations 1965, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Social Security (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations 1965\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
  - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1985.
- **2. Interpretation**—Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the definition of the term "district", and substituting the following definition:
  - "'District' means a health district constituted under the Health Act 1956; and includes an area health district constituted under the Area Health Boards Act 1983:".

Hospital Boards and area health boards**—Regulation 20 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "Hospital Board" wherever they occur, the words "or an area health board".

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations extend to area health districts and area health boards those provisions of the principal regulations which apply to health districts and Hospital Boards.
