**THE SOCIAL SCIENCE BURSARIES REGULATIONS 1966**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 3rd day of August 1966

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Social Science Bursaries Regulations 1966.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Director-General” means the Director-General of Education:

“School of Social Science” means the School of Social Science at the Victoria University of Wellington:

“Tuition fees”, in relation to the holder of a bursary, means the consolidated fee duly prescribed by the Council of the Victoria University of Wellington for the course taken under the bursary.

*Award and Tenure*

3. (1) The Director-General may in any year award not more than four Social Science Bursaries tenable at the School of Social Science, and shall give preference in the award of those bursaries to applicants who have been nominated by church or other organisations engaged in social welfare work.

(2) No applicant shall be awarded a bursary unless he enters into an agreement in a form approved by the Director-General under which he undertakes, as a condition of that award, to serve continuously as a social worker in the service of an organisation approved by the Director-General for two years after the date of the completion of his course under the bursary.

4. The tenure of every Social Science Bursary shall be subject to such conditions as the Director-General may from time to time determine.

*Value and Term*

5. The maximum annual value of a Social Science Bursary shall be £80, and in addition there may be paid—

- (a) A boarding allowance at the rate of £125 a year if in the opinion of the Director-General the payment of that allowance is justified; and
- (b) Tuition fees for the course for the Diploma in Social Science.

6. Where any person holds concurrently a Social Science Bursary and any other scholarship, bursary, or other grant or allowance from public funds, the value of the Social Science Bursary may be reduced by such amount as the Director-General considers reasonable in the circumstances.

7. The term of a Social Science Bursary shall be one year, but the term may be extended for a further year where the Director-General, on the recommendation of the Professor in charge of the School of Social Science, so approves.

*Revocation*

8. The Social Science Bursaries Regulations 1956\* and the Social Science Bursaries Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 1† are hereby revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations make provision for the grant in any year of not more than four Social Science Bursaries tenable at the School of Social Science at the Victoria University of Wellington.
