ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 20th day of August 1973

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Social Science Bursaries Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Social Science Bursaries Regulations 1966* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Value of Bursary and boarding allowance—(1) Regulation 5 of the principal regulations (as amended by section 7 of the Decimal Currency Act 1964) is hereby further amended by omitting the expression "\$160", and substituting the expression "\$255".

(2) The said regulation 5 is hereby further amended by omitting from paragraph (a) the expression "\$250", and substituting the expression "\$350".

(3) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (1) or subclause (2) of this regulation, in the year 1973 the maximum value of a Social Science Bursary shall be \$223, and the maximum value of each boarding allowance payable under the principal regulations shall be \$317.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Social Science Bursaries Regulations 1966 by increasing the maximum annual value of the Social Science Bursary from \$160 to \$255, and the annual value of the boarding allowance from \$250 to \$350; but in the year 1973 the maximum value of the bursary will be \$223, and of each boarding allowance will be \$317.
