

THE SECONDARY SCHOOLS BURSARIES REGULATIONS 1977, AMENDMENT NO. 2

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Secondary Schools Bursaries Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Secondary Schools Bursaries Regulations 1977* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- **2. Tenure**—Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:

"(1) Bursaries shall be tenable only at schools approved for accrediting purposes in respect of 1985 by the University Entrance Board".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Secondary Schools Bursaries Regulations 1977 to take account of the fact that there will be no University Entrance Examinations after 1985. At present bursaries awarded under the principal regulations are tenable only at schools for the time being approved for accrediting purposes by the University Entrance Board. The amendment makes such bursaries tenable only at schools so approved in respect of 1985.
