PURSUANT to section 1 (3) of the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title—This order may be cited as the State Services Conditions of Employment Act Commencement Order 1979.

2. Commencement of Part VIII in respect of employees of the Public Service—Part VIII of the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977, to the extent that it applies to acts or omissions of employees, shall come into force on the 23rd day of June 1979 in respect of acts and omissions of employees of the Public Service (as defined in section 2 of the State Services Act 1962).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

Part VIII of the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977 (which is based on Part IX of the Industrial Relations Act 1973) relates to unjustified industrial action. That Part does not at present apply in respect of the acts or omissions of employees of any of the State services. This order brings that Part into force on 23 June 1979 in respect of acts and omissions of employees of the Public Service.
