ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 17th day of December 1979

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL
PURSUANT to section 1 (4) of the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Conditions of Employment Act Suspension Order 1979.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Suspension of application of Part VIII to employees of the Public Service—The application of Part VIII of the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977 to acts or omissions of employees of the Public Service (as defined in section 2 of the State Services Act 1962) is hereby suspended.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

Part VIII of the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977 relates to unjustified industrial action. The State Services Conditions of Employment Act Commencement Order 1979 applied that Part to acts or omissions of employees of the Public Service. This order suspends the application of that Part to acts or omissions of that class of employees.
