PURSUANT to section 116 of the Social Security Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title, commencement, and application—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Security (X-Ray Diagnostic Services) Regulations 1979, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Social Security (X-Ray Diagnostic Services) Regulations 1979* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of September 1982, and shall apply to X-ray diagnostic services provided on or after that date.

2. Increasing certain fees—The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the fees set out opposite to the items described in the Schedule to these regulations, and substituting the new fees set out opposite to those items.

New Fees
