PURSUANT to section 94 (2) of the Social Security Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Social Security (Travelling Fees) Order 1978.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of January 1978.

2. Travelling fees—The travelling fees payable to medical practitioners under section 94 (2) of the Social Security Act 1964 shall be computed at the rate of 16 cents for every kilometre or part of a kilometre travelled in accordance with that subsection.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This order fixes the travelling fees (previously known as mileage fees) payable to those medical practitioners entitled to receive it at 16 cents for every kilometre or part of a kilometre travelled. This increases the present fee of 8 cents per kilometre by 8 cents.
