# THE SECONDARY SCHOOL GRANTS REGULATIONS 1967, AMENDMENT NO. 3

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 29th day of May 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Secondary School Grants Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Secondary School Grants Regulations 1967\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Grants for general expenses—(1) Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a) of subclause (1), and substituting the following paragraph:

"(a) A grant which shall be applied in accordance with regulation 6 of these regulations, and which shall be ascertained in accordance with the following scale:

(2) The Secondary School Grants Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 2 are hereby consequentially revoked.

3. Meaning of number of pupils, etc.—Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to paragraph (a) the words ", except in any school at which 30 percent or more of the pupils in normal day classes are Maoris in which case the number of pupils shall be increased by 0.2 pupil for each Maori pupil".

4. Application of grants-Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (k) of subclause (2), and substituting the following paragraph:

"(k) Expenses of school break-up ceremonies and expenses of school prizes together not exceeding in the year of any grant the sum of \$100 unless the school has on the 1st day of March of that year more than 500 pupils, in which case the sum of \$100 shall be increased by \$40 for each 250 pupils above the first 500 pupils and by \$40 for any remaining number of pupils that may be less than 250 pupils."

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Secondary School Grants Regulations 1967 by increasing grants to the governing bodies of secondary schools in respect of normal day classes, and by ceasing to pay grants in respect of technical, continuation day, or evening classes that are non-vocational. The maximum amount of any grant for general expenses which may be spent on school break-up ceremonies and prizes is increased. The maximum amount for schools which have not more than 500 pupils in present from \$20 to \$2100. In the case of schools which have more than so increased, the maximum amount for schools which have more than 500 pupils is increased from \$70 to \$100. In the case of schools which have more than 500 pupils the amount of \$100 is increased by the sum of \$40, instead of \$30 at present, for each 250 pupils above the first 500 pupils, and for any remaining number of pupils that may be less than 250 pupils.
