



**THE SECONDARY SCHOOL GRANTS REGULATIONS 1974,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Secondary School Grants Regulations 1974, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Secondary School Grants Regulations 1974* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Application of grants—(1) Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclauses:

“(3) For the purposes of subclause (4) of this regulation, the maximum component for any school in any year is the greater of—

“(a) An amount equal to 1 percent of the grant so paid in respect of that year for that school; and

“(b) \$400.

“(4) The governing body of a school shall not in any year, out of the grants so paid in respect of that year for the schools under its control, expend upon the expense of break-up ceremonies or prizes for those schools any sums that together exceed the total of the maximum components of those schools in that year.”

(2) Subclause (2) of the said regulation 11 is hereby consequentially amended by revoking paragraph (k), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(k) Subject to subclause (4) of this regulation, expenses of school break-up ceremonies and expenses of school prizes:”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Secondary School Grants Regulations 1974 in 2 respects. First, the maximum amount permitted to be expended in respect of break-up ceremonies and prizes at a secondary school is changed from an amount calculated by reference to the school's roll to an amount that is the greater of \$400 and 1 percent of the school's general expenses grant. Secondly, it is provided that where several secondary schools are under the control of a single governing body, that body can underspend the allowable amount in respect of one school and use the difference to augment the amount expended in respect of another.
