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THE SOCIAL SECURITY (EMPLOYMENT OF AGE BENEFICIARIES) EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1942

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Social Security (Employment of Age Beneficiaries) Emergency Regulations 1942.
- 2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, expressions defined in Part II of the Social Security Act, 1938, shall have the meanings so defined.
- 3. For the purpose of ascertaining the income of any applicant for an age-benefit the Social Security Commission may deduct from the income computed in accordance with section 61 of the Social Security Act, 1938, so much thereof as represents the earnings of the applicant in respect of any period of employment, if no age-benefit has been paid to him in respect of that period of employment.
- 4. The Commission, in its discretion, may refuse any application for a deduction as aforesaid, or may grant the application either wholly or partly, and either unconditionally or upon or subject to such conditions as the Commission thinks fit, whether as to the acceptance by the applicant of further employment or otherwise.
