ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington this 11th day of November 1985

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COLINCIL

PURSUANT to section 61H of the Social Security Act 1964, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. **Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Social Security (Rates of Benefits) Order (No. 2) 1985.
- (2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 17th day of July 1985.
- 2. Increasing rates of benefits on and after 17 July 1985—Each provision of the Social Security Act 1964 specified in the first column of the Schedule to this order is hereby amended by omitting every expression set out opposite to it in the second column of that Schedule, wherever that expression occurs, and substituting in each case the expression set out opposite to it in the third column of that Schedule.
- **3. Revocation**—The Social Security (Rates of Benefits) Order 1985* is hereby amended by revoking so much of the Schedule as relates to—
 - (a) The Third, Fourth, Sixth to Ninth, Sixteenth, and Seventeenth Schedules to the Social Security Act 1964:
 - (b) Clauses 1 (a) (i) and 2 (a) (i) of the Fourteenth Schedule to that Act.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order increases the rates of widows', invalids', miners', domestic purposes, sickness, unemployment, and related emergency benefits on and after 17 July 1985. The rates of the benefits are increased by \$9.67 a week for unmarried persons and \$16.12 a week for married

The rate of child supplement for the first child of a solo parent receiving a social security benefit is increased by \$6.45 to \$66.99 a week.

The rate of orphans' benefits is increased by \$4.80 to \$54 a week.
