THE STATE SERVICES SALARY ORDER (NO. 12) 1974

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Salary Order (No. 12) 1974.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of July 1974.

2. Maximum salary that an employing authority may prescribe—For the purposes of section 18 (1) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, the maximum salary that any employing authority may prescribe shall be \$15,488 a year.

3. Maximum salary that the State Services Tribunal may prescribe—For the purposes of section 32 (4) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, the maximum salary that the State Services Tribunal may by order prescribe shall be \$15,488 a year.

4. Maximum salary that a Single Service Tribunal may prescribe—For the purposes of section 44 (4) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, the maximum salary that a Single Service Tribunal may by order prescribe shall be \$15,488 a year.

5. Revocation—The State Services Salary Order (No. 8) 1974* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order specifies the maximum salary that may be prescribed under the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969 by an employing authority or the State Services Tribunal or a Single Service Tribunal.

It replaces the State Services Salary Order (No. 8) 1974 (which increased the maximum by 9 percent with effect from 1 July 1974), and increases the maximum by 13 percent with effect from that date.
