## THE STATE SERVICES SALARY ORDER 1976

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 23rd day of February 1976

PURSUANT to the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

## ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Salary Order 1976.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 27th day of January 1976.

2. Maximum salary that an employing authority may prescribe—For the purposes of section 18 (1) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, the maximum salary that any employing authority may prescribe shall be \$16,260 a year.

3. Maximum salary that the State Services Tribunal may prescribe— For the purposes of section 32 (4) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, the maximum salary that the State Services Tribunal may by order prescribe shall be \$16,260 a year.

4. Maximum salary that a Single Service Tribunal may prescribe— For the purposes of section 44 (4) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, the maximum salary that a Single Service Tribunal may by order prescribe shall be \$16,260 a year.

5. Revocation—The State Services Salary Order (No. 2) 1975\* is hereby revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This order, which is deemed to have come into force on 27 January 1976, specifies the maximum salary that may be prescribed under the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969 by an employing authority or the State Services Tribunal or a Single Service Tribunal. It increases that maximum by \$188 a year. This is the amount of the third cost of living adjustment provided for in the Wage Adjustment Regulations 1974, Amendment No. 7.
