ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 25th day of January 1977

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Social Security Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

—
O R D E R

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Social Security (National Superannuation) Order 1977.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 9th day of February 1977.

2. Rates of national superannuation—The rates of national superannuation shall be—

- (a) In the case of a married couple both of whom are entitled to receive national superannuation, \$76.84 a week:
- (b) In the case of an unmarried person, \$46.10 a week:
- (c) In the case of a married person whose spouse is not entitled to receive national superannuation—
 - (i) If the spouse of the applicant is, in his or her own right, in receipt of a benefit under Part I of the Social Security Act 1964 or of an economic pension, war veteran's allowance, or war service pension under the War Pensions Act 1954, \$38.42 a week:
 - (ii) In any other case, \$46.10 a week.

This order fixes the rates of national superannuation.
