## ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 20th day of August 1979

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

## ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Salary Order (No. 2) 1979.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 3rd day of September 1979.

2. Maximum salary that an employing authority may prescribe—For the purposes of section 20 (1) of the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977, the maximum salary that any employing authority may by determination prescribe shall be \$26,300 a year.

**3. Maximum salary that the Public Sector Tribunal may prescribe**— For the purposes of section 43 (4) of the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977, the maximum salary that the Public Sector Tribunal may by order prescribe shall be \$26,300 a year.

4. Maximum salary that a Single Service Tribunal may prescribe— For the purposes of section 56 (4) of the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977, the maximum salary that a Single Service Tribunal may by order prescribe shall be \$26,300 a year.

5. Revocation—The State Services Salary Order 1979\* is hereby revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes isto force on 3 September 1979, increases by 4.5 percent the maximum salary that may be prescribed under the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977 by an employing authority or the Public Sector Tribunal or a Single Service Tribunal.
