PURSUANT to the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969 and to section 27 of the Stabilisation of Remuneration Act 1971, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Salary Order (No. 3) 1972.

(2) Except as provided in clause 3 of this order, this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 21st day of July 1971.

2. Higher salaries—(1) Commencing with the dates respectively shown in the headings of the columns in the First Schedule to this order headed "Yearly Rate of Salary on and from 21 July 1971" and "Yearly Rate of Salary on and from 31 January 1972", the salaries set out in that Schedule in respect of the positions mentioned therein (being positions excluded by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*, from Parts II, III, and IV of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(2) Commencing with the dates respectively shown in the headings of the columns in the Second Schedule to this order headed "Yearly Rate of Salary on and from 21 July 1971" and "Yearly Rate of Salary on and from 31 January 1972", the salaries set out in that Schedule in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being salaries exceeding the amount prescribed by Order in Council under subsection (1) of section 18 of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(3) The increments that are payable shall in each case be annual increments.

3. Commencement of former salary orders—(1) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (2) of clause 1 of the State Services Salary Order (No. 7) 1971*, that order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 27th day of December 1970.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (1) of clause 2 of the State Services Salary Order 1972[†], the salaries set out in the column of the First Schedule to that order headed "Yearly Rate of Salary on and from 15 January 1971" may be paid in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule on and from the 27th day of December 1970.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order prescribes higher salaries in the State Services.

The adjustments in pay scales made by clause 2 are made pursuant to section 27 of the Stabilisation of Remuneration Act 1971 in order to apply to State employees the cost of living orders made under section 16 of that Act and having effect on 21 July 1971 and 31 January 1972 respectively.

Člause 3 alters from 15 January 1971 to 27 December 1970 the date of commencement of the former order prescribing higher salaries in the State Services in order to apply to those salaries the effect to a decision of the State Services Tribunal.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 16 March 1972. This order is administered in the State Services Commission.
