Pursuant to the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

#### ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Salary Order (No. 3) 1974.
- (2) Subject to the provisions of clause 3 of this order, this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 11th day of February 1974.
- 2. Higher salaries—(1) Subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the First Schedule hereto in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being positions excluded by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*, from Parts II, III, and IV of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (1) of this clause, and subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the Second Schedule hereto in respect of the positions specified in that Schedule (being positions excluded by the Minister, by notice in the Gazette, from Parts II, III, and IV of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.
- (3) Subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the Third Schedule hereto in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being salaries exceeding the amount prescribed by Order in Council under section 18 (1) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.
- (4) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (3) of this clause, and subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the Fourth

Schedule hereto in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being salaries exceeding the amount prescribed by Order in Council under section 18 (1) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(5) The increments that are payable shall in each case be annual

increments.

## 3. Modification of provisions of First and Third Schedules—(1)

Notwithstanding anything in the First Schedule hereto-

(a) On and after the 1st day of April 1974, the salary payable in respect of the first of the two positions of Assistant Director-General, Agriculture and Fisheries, mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be paid at the rate prescribed for that position in the Second Schedule hereto and the provisions o of the First Schedule hereto relating to that position shal cease to have effect:

(b) On and after the 11th day of February 1974, the salary payable to the officer holding the position of Comptroller of Customs on the 26th day of October 1972 shall, so long as he holds that position, be paid at the rate prescribed for that position in the

Second Schedule hereto:

(c) On and after the 11th day of February 1974, the salary payable to the officer holding the position of Secretary of Mines on the 26th day of October 1972 shall, so long as he holds that position, be paid at the rate prescribed for that position in the Second Schedule hereto:

(d) On and after the 11th day of February 1974, the salary payable to the officer holding the position of Commissioner for the Environment on the 3rd day of December 1973 shall, so long as he holds that position, be paid at the rate prescribed for that position in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in the Third Schedule hereto—

- (a) On and after the 11th day of February 1974, the salary payable to the officer holding on that date the position of Director, Division of Clinical Services, shall, so long as he holds that position, be paid at the rate prescribed for that position in the Fourth Schedule hereto:
- (b) On and after the 1st day of April 1974, the salary payable to the Government Actuary shall be paid at the rate prescribed for that position in the Fourth Schedule hereto and the provisions of the Third Schedule hereto relating to that position shall cease to have effect.
- **4. Revocations**—The following orders are hereby revoked:
- (a) The State Services Salary Order (No. 8) 1973\*:(b) The State Services Salary Order (No. 9) 1973†.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order incorporates in the higher salaries in the State Services the amount of This order incorporates in the higher salaries in the State Services the amount of the 2.7 percent wage adjustment order made pursuant to regulation 14 (4) of the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1973. The wage adjustment order came into force on 11 February 1974 and this order is retrospective to that date.

This order also increases the salaries of an Assistant Director-General of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Government Actuary consequent on a regrading of their positions. These regrading increases take effect on 1 April 1974.
