Pursuant to the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation to the Prime Minister made by the Remuneration Authority pursuant to regulation 26 of the Stabilisation of Remuneration Regulations 1972\*, hereby makes the following order.

## ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Salary Order (No. 4) 1972.
- (2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 29th day of February 1972.
- 2. Higher salary—(1) The salary set out in the Schedule to this order in respect of the position specified therein (being a salary exceeding the amount prescribed by Order in Council under section 18 (1) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of that position.
  - (2) The increment that is payable shall be an annual increment.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. The effect of this order is to prescribe a special rate of salary for the position of Assistant General Manager (Engineering and Development) in the New Zealand Government Railways Department for a period of 12 months, after which the maximum for the position will be the same as the higher rate for Assistant General Manager.
