

THE STATE SERVICES SALARY ORDER (NO. 5) 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENGY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation to the Prime Minister made by the Remuneration Authority pursuant to regulation 26 of the Stabilisation of Remuneration Regulations 1972*, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Salary Order (No. 5) 1972.
- (2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1972.
- 2. Higher salaries—(1) The salaries set out in the First Schedule to this order in respect of the positions mentioned therein (being positions excluded by the Minister, by notice in the Gazette, from Parts II, III, and IV of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.
- (2) The salaries set out in the Second Schedule to this order in respect of the positions mentioned therein (being salaries exceeding the amount prescribed by Order in Council under subsection (1) of section 18 of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.
- (3) The increments that are payable shall in each case be annual increments.
- **3. Amendments**—The First Schedule to the State Services Salary Order (No. 3) 1972† is hereby amended—
 - (a) By revoking so much thereof as relates to the position of Assistant Comptroller of Customs (being the first of the 2 such positions mentioned in that Schedule):
 - (b) By revoking so much thereof as relates to the position of Assistant Secretary of Industries and Commerce (being the first of the 3 such positions mentioned in that Schedule):
 - (c) By revoking so much thereof as relates to the position of Assistant Director-General of the Post Office.
