THE STATE SERVICES SALARY ORDER (NO. 8) 1972

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 16th day of October 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Salary Order (No. 8) 1972.

(2) Subject to the provisions of clauses 2 and 3 of this order, this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 15th day of October 1971.

2. Higher salaries—(1) Subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the First Schedule hereto in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being positions excluded by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*, from Parts II, III, and IV of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (1) of this clause, commencing with the dates respectively shown in the column in the Second Schedule hereto headed "Effective Date" the salaries set out in that Schedule in respect of the positions specified in that Schedule (being positions excluded by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*, from Parts II, III, and IV of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(3) Subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the Third Schedule hereto in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being salaries exceeding the amount prescribed by Order in Council under section 18 (1) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(4) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (3) of this clause, commencing with the dates respectively shown in the column in the Fourth Schedule hereto headed "Effective Date" the salaries set out in that Schedule in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being salaries exceeding the amount prescribed by Order in Council under section 18 (1) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(5) The increments that are payable shall in each case be annual increments.

3. Modification of provisions of First and Third Schedules—

(1) Where provision is made in the Second Schedule hereto fixing the salary in respect of any position for which a salary is fixed by the First Schedule hereto, the provisions of the First Schedule relating to that position shall cease to have effect on the effective date of the provisions of the Second Schedule fixing the salary for that position.

(2) Where provision is made in the Fourth Schedule hereto fixing the salary in respect of any position for which a salary is fixed by the Third Schedule hereto, the provisions of the Third Schedule relating to that position shall cease to have effect on the effective date of the provisions of the Fourth Schedule fixing the salary for that position.

(3) On and after the 1st day of September 1972—

(a) The provisions of the First Schedule hereto relating to the Department of Agriculture shall have effect as if for the word "Agriculture" in the first column there were substituted the words "Agriculture and Fisheries":

(b) The provisions of the First Schedule hereto relating to the Marine Department shall cease to have effect.

(4) On and after the 1st day of April 1972—

(a) The provisions of the First Schedule hereto relating to the Social Security Department shall cease to have effect:

(b) The provisions of the Third Schedule hereto relating to the position of Superintendent of Child Welfare in the Department of Education shall cease to have effect.

(5) For the purposes of subclause (1) of this clause—

(a) The position of Assistant Comptroller of Customs referred to in the Second Schedule hereto is the same position as the first of the 2 positions of Assistant Comptroller of Customs referred to in the First Schedule hereto:

(b) The position of Assistant Secretary of Industries and Commerce referred to in the Second Schedule hereto is the same position as the first of the 3 positions of Assistant Secretary of Industries and Commerce referred to in the First Schedule hereto.

The adjustments are in accordance with regulation 27 of the Stabilisation of Remuneration Regulations 1972, and the consent of the Remuneration Authority is not required.
