ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 17th day of December 1973

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Salary Order (No. 9) 1973.

(2) Subject to the provisions of clause 3 of this order, this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 26th day of October 1972.

2. Higher salaries—(1) Subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the First Schedule hereto in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being positions excluded by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*, from Parts II, III, and IV of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (1) of this clause, and subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the Second Schedule hereto in respect of the positions specified in that Schedule (being positions excluded by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*, from Parts II, III, and IV of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(3) Subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the Third Schedule hereto in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being salaries exceeding the amount prescribed by Order in Council under section 18 (1) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(4) The increments that are payable shall in each case be annual increments.

3. Modification of provisions of First, Second, and Third Schedules—(1) Subject to subclause (2) of this clause, where provision is made in the Second Schedule hereto prescribing the salary in respect of any position for which a salary is prescribed by the First Schedule hereto, the provisions of the First Schedule relating to that position shall cease to have effect on the effective date of the provisions of the Second Schedule hereto prescribing the salary for that position.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in the First Schedule hereto—

- (a) On and after the 26th day of October 1972, the officers holding on that date the positions of Comptroller of Customs and Secretary of Mines shall, so long as they hold those positions, be paid the rates prescribed for those positions in the Second Schedule hereto:
- (b) On and after the 23rd day of November 1972, the Commissioner of Energy Resources shall be paid the rates prescribed for that position in the Second Schedule hereto:
- (c) On and after the 1st day of April 1973,—
- (i) The following positions shall be paid the rates prescribed for those positions in the Second Schedule or Third Schedule hereto, as the case may be:

- (d) On and after the 27th day of April 1973, the Deputy Secretary, Internal Affairs, shall be paid the rates prescribed for that position in the Second Schedule hereto:
- (e) On and after the 30th day of August 1973, the Deputy Secretary, Trade and Industry, shall be paid the rates prescribed for that position in the Second Schedule hereto:

- (g) On and after the 4th day of September 1973, the Deputy Secretary, Treasury, shall be paid the rates prescribed for that position in

the Second Schedule hereto. This position is in addition to that Deputy Secretary, Treasury, shown in the First Schedule hereto:

- (h) The effective date for the payment of the rates prescribed in the First Schedule hereto for the position of Commissioner for the Environment shall be the 30th day of August 1973:

Provided that the salary payable to the officer holding that position on the 3rd day of December 1973, so long as he holds that position, shall be that rate prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

- (3) On and after the 30th day of August 1973, the provisions of the First Schedule hereto relating to the position of the first of the 3 positions of Assistant Secretary, Trade and Industry, shall be deemed to have ceased to have had effect.

4. Amendments and Revocations—(1) The Schedule to The State Services Salary Order (No. 5) 1973* is hereby amended by revoking so much thereof as relates to the position of Chief Executive, Auckland Hospital Board.

(2) The Schedule to The State Services Salary Order (No. 8) 1973† is hereby amended by revoking so much thereof as relates to the position of Chief Executive, Auckland Hospital Board.
