ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 26th day of June 1974

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the State Services Salary Order (No. 9) 1974.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1974.

2. Higher salaries—(1) Subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the First Schedule hereto in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being positions excluded by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*, from Parts II, III, and IV of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (1) of this clause, and subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the Second Schedule hereto in respect of the positions specified in that Schedule (being positions excluded by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*, from Parts II, III, and IV of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(3) Subject to clause 3 of this order, the salaries set out in the Third Schedule hereto in respect of the positions mentioned in that Schedule (being salaries exceeding the amount prescribed by Order in Council under section 18 (1) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of those positions.

(4) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (3) of this clause, and subject to clause 3 of this order, the salary set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto in respect of the position mentioned in that Schedule (being a salary exceeding the amount prescribed by Order in Council under section 18 (1) of the State Services Remuneration and Conditions of Employment Act 1969) may be paid in respect of that position.

(5) The increments that are payable shall in each case be annual increments.

3. Modification of provisions of First and Third Schedules—

(1) Notwithstanding anything in the First Schedule hereto—

- (a) On and after the 1st day of July 1974, the salary payable to the officer holding the position of Comptroller of Customs on the 26th day of October 1972 shall, so long as he holds that position, be paid at the rate prescribed for that position in the Second Schedule hereto:
- (b) On and after the 1st day of July 1974, the salary payable to the officer holding the position of Secretary of Mines on the 26th day of October 1972 shall, so long as he holds that position, be paid at the rate prescribed for that position in the Second Schedule hereto:
- (c) On and after the 1st day of July 1974, the salary payable to the officer holding the position of Commissioner for the Environment on the 3rd day of December 1973 shall, so long as he holds that position, be paid at the rate prescribed for that position in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in the Third Schedule hereto, on and after the 1st day of July 1974, the salary payable to the officer holding the position of Director, Division of Clinical Services, on the 11th day of February 1974 shall, so long as he holds that position, be paid at the rate prescribed for that position in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order prescribes higher salaries in the State Services. It increases by 9 percent as from 1 July 1974 the rates payable immediately before that date.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936.

Date of notification in *Gazette*: 28 June 1974.

This order is administered in the State Services Commission.
