# THE SECONDARY SCHOOL TECHNICAL BURSARIES REGULATIONS 1977, AMENDMENT NO. 1

Pursuant to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the GovernorGeneral, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

1. Title-These regulations may be cited as the Secondary School Technical Bursaries Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 1 and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Secondary School Technical Bursaries Regulations 1977* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
2. Value of bursary--Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression " $\$ 400$ ", and substituting the expression " $\$ 500$ ".
3. Transitional-The principal regulations are hereby further amended by inserting, after regulation 4, the following regulation:
" 4 A . Notwithstanding regulation 4 and regulation 17 of these regulations, the maximum annual value of a bursary for the year 1977 shall be $\$ 433$, payable by instalments of $\$ 133$ each in respect of the first and second terms and $\$ 167$ in respect of the third term; and deductions from payments in respect of the third term on account of absence shall be made at the rate of $\$ 2.50$ per day."

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the value of a secondary school technical bursary from $\$ 400$ to $\$ 500$ per year, applicable to only the third term of the 1977 year.
