**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 8th day of  
March, 1950

Present :

THE HON. K. J. HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Sales Tax Act, 1932-33, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Sales Tax Exemption Order 1950.
2. This Order shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.
3. The goods of the classes and kinds specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from sales tax.

**SCHEDULE**

Bread-toasters.  
Carpet sweeping and floor polishing machines  
Laundry irons (flat irons), all kinds.  
Vacuum cleaners.

---

Chilled shot.  
Glycerine.  
Leather.  
Metal foil.  
Methylated spirit without pyridine.  
Pig iron.  
Roller lapping.  
Shellac, gums, and resins.  
Slagwool; rockwool; asbestos fibre, rope and cloth; and similar non-combustible heat-insulating materials.  
Welding and brazing rods.  
Yarns—viz., cotton, rayon, nylon, and mixtures thereof.
