Pursuant to section 12 of the Sales Tax Act, 1932–33, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Sales Tax Exemption Order 1950.
- 2. This Order shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.
- 3. The goods of the classes and kinds specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from sales tax.

SCHEDULE

Bread-toasters.
Carpet sweeping and floor polishing machines
Laundry irons (flat irons), all kinds.
Vacuum cleaners.

Chilled shot.
Glycerine.
Leather.
Metal foil.
Methylated spirit without pyridine.

Pig iron.

Roller lapping.

Shellac, gums, and resins.

Slagwool; rockwool; asbestos fibre, rope and cloth; and similar non-combustible heat-insulating materials.

Welding and brazing rods.

Yarns—viz., cotton, rayon, nylon, and mixtures thereof.
