PURSUANT to section 12 of the Sales Tax Act 1932-33, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

---

**ORDER**

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Sales Tax Exemption Order 1961, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Sales Tax Exemption Order 1961\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 20th day of September 1963.

2. (1) Goods of the classes or kinds specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from sales tax.

(2) The Second Schedule to the principal order is hereby consequentially amended by inserting, after item 179, the new item 179A set out in the Schedule hereto.

This order exempts from sales tax, as from 20 September 1963, stamp mounts and corners for mounting photographs.
