Pursuant to section 15 of the Sales Tax Act 1974, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Sales Tax Exemption Order 1974, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Sales Tax Exemption Order 1974* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its

notification in the Gazette.

2. Goods exempted from sales tax—(1) Goods of the class or kind specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from sales tax.

(2) The First Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by revoking item 293 and substituting the item 293 set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

EXEMPTION FROM SALES TAX

Item No.

Goods

293 Ships and other vessels, but not including new engines installed therein except engines installed in such commercial and other vessels as may be approved by the Minister; dredges and floating docks; such articles peculiar to use on ships, other vessels, dredges and floating docks, as may be approved by the Minister.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This order amends the Sales Tax Exemption Order 1974 and its effect is to exclude from the exemption item for ships and other vessels, engines other than those fitted to vessels of such types as may be approved by the Minister.
