ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 26th day of March 1979

THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 9 of the Shop Trading Hours Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the advice of the Minister of Labour, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Shop Trading Hours (Approved and Special Goods) Order 1979.

 $(\hat{2})$ This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Approved goods—All goods belonging to any class of goods specified in the First Schedule to this order are hereby declared to be approved goods.

3. Special goods—All goods belonging to any class of goods specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this order are hereby declared to be special goods that may be sold on any Saturday (other than New Year's Day, the day after New Year's Day, Waitangi Day, Anzac Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day) during the hours specified in the second column of that schedule opposite the reference to the class of goods concerned.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Approved Goods

Aquarium Flora and Fauna

Aquarium flora and fauna (including tropical fish), and food and ancillary equipment necessary for the keeping of such flora and fauna.

Bakers' and Pastrycooks' Goods

Biscuits. Bread. Cake. Pastry. Pies. Sandwiches. Smallgoods.

Condiments

Mayonnaise. Mustard. Pepper. Pickles. Relishes. Salt. Sauces. Vinegar.

Confectionery

Confectionery and sweetmeats.

Dairy Produce

Butter. Cheese, including packaged and processed cheese. Cream, including reduced cream. Milk, including condensed and dried milk. Yoghurt.

Drinks

Aerated waters. Cordial extracts. Cordials. Soft drinks.

Fish

Fresh fish and shellfish, if it is sold by the owner of a registered fishing boat or a person appointed by him in that behalf, direct from that boat at the place where it is moored, berthed, or beached, or from a stall within 500 metres from that place, and if it has been taken from that boat under a valid boat fishing permit for the method or methods used to take that fresh fish or shellfish. 1979/60

FIRST SCHEDULE—continued

Frozen Foods

Chickens, frozen, including chicken pieces. Fruit, frozen. Ice blocks. Ice cream. Meals, pre-cooked and deep frozen. Vegetables, frozen.

Fruit and Flowers

Cut flowers—including bouquets. Wreaths. Fruit, fresh, bottled, or tinned.

Fuels

Carbonettes, and any other solid fuels derived from coal, in retail packages not exceeding 20 kilogrammes. Charcoal. Coal. Coke. Dieseline. Firewood. Kerosine.

Gardening Supplies

Compost. Fertilisers. Fungicides. Garden dusts. Garden sprays. Horticultural polythene. Insecticides. Manures. Materials and preparations used for protecting plants and shrubs against weather conditions, animals, birds, or insects, but excluding glasshouses and other structures. Mulches. Peat. Pesticides. Plant pots and trays, excluding ornamental pots and pottery. Potting mixtures and ingredients. Soil conditioners. Stakes and ties for plants or shrubs. Weed killers.

Groceries, Miscellaneous

Breakfast cereals, pre-packaged. Baked beans. Cocoa, including cocoa compounds. Coffee, including coffee compounds. Eggs.

FIRST SCHEDULE—continued

Groceries, Miscellaneous-continued

Extracts, meat or vegetable. Fish, tinned. Flour, in pre-packed quantities not exceeding 2 kilogrammes. Honey. Jam. Jelly crystals. Nuts, shelled and pre-wrapped. Pastes and spreads. Soups, tinned or packaged. Spaghetti, tinned. Sugar, in pre-packed quantities not exceeding 1.5 kilogrammes. Tea, in pre-packed quantities not exceeding 250 grammes.

Magazines and Periodicals

Magazines and periodicals; this shall not be deemed to include books published either in hard-bound or paper-backed editions. Newspapers.

Meats and Smallgoods

Bacon. Ham, cooked. Luncheon sausage. Meat, tinned. Sausages, pre-wrapped. Saveloys.

Medicinal and Household Goods

Aspirin and similar headache tablets. Babies bottles. Babies disposable napkins and napkin liners. Babies teats. Baby foods. Cough mixtures. Disposable paper tissues. Fly sprays. Household cleaning agents including detergents, disinfectants, and soap powders. Light bulbs. Medicated confectionery. Razor blades. Sanitary towels and tampons. Sticking plaster, bandages, and similar emergency dressings. Sunburn lotions. Toilet rolls. Toilet soaps. Toothbrushes. Toothpaste.

Miscellaneous Items Birdseed. Candles. Fuse wire. Greeting cards. Methylated spirits. Nylon stockings. Pantyhose. Pet food, tinned. Torches and torch batteries. Turpentine. Motor Accessories Motor spirits, petrol, and oil. Parts or accessories for motor vehicles, farm machinery, or farm implements. Photographic Goods Films. Plants, etc. Corms. Plants. Seedlings. Seeds. Shrubs. Trees. Tubers (including seed potatoes). Prepared or Cooked Foods Cooked fish. Cooked chipped potatoes. Cooked oysters. Cooked sausages. Cooked saveloys. Meals, including refreshments, consumed on the premises in which they are sold. Take-away foods, being prepared or cooked foods in a form ready for immediate human consumption. Tobacco, etc. Cigarettes. Cigarette papers. Cigars. Matches. Tobacco. Vegetables Lettuce. Tomatoes. Vegetables, tinned or freeze-dried. Vegetables sold by the grower thereof on the premises where they are grown.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order promulgates a new list of approved goods and special goods for the purposes of the Shop Trading Hours Act 1977. The list supersedes that set out in the First and Second Schedules to that Act, and differs from it in only certain respects.

The major changes are that the category of building supplies and handyman's requisites has been enlarged and changed from approved goods (that may be sold at any time) to special goods (that may be sold only on weekdays or between 7 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturdays), trailers, caravans, and boats have been changed from approved goods (that may be sold at any time) to special goods (that may be sold at any time) to special goods (that may be sold at any time) to special goods (that may be sold at any time) to special goods (that may be sold at any time) to special goods (that may be sold at any time) to special goods (that may be sold only on weekdays or between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Saturdays), and frozen chicken, flowers, wreaths, various kinds of gardening supplies, pet food, greeting cards, detergents, torches, turpentine and methylated spirits, and certain other minor items have been made approved goods.
