PURSUANT to the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title—This order may be cited as the Shipping Tonnage Order 1969.

2. Acceptance of tonnage measurements of other countries—For the purposes of section 450 of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, it is hereby directed that ships of the countries specified in the Schedule to this order shall, without being remeasured in New Zealand, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is that ships of the foreign countries specified in the Schedule will be deemed to be of the tonnage specified in their certificates of registry or other national papers to the same extent and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a New Zealand ship under the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952.
