## THE SHIPPING TONNAGE ORDER 1970

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 25th day of May 1970

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

### ORDER

**1. Title**—This order may be cited as the Shipping Tonnage Order 1970.

**2. Acceptance of tonnage measurements of other countries**—For the purposes of section 450 of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, it is hereby directed that ships of the countries specified in the Schedule to this order shall, without being remeasured in New Zealand, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers.

**3. Revocation**—The Shipping Tonnage Order 1969\* is hereby revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

The effect of this order is that ships of the foreign countries specified in the Schedule will be deemed to be of the tonnage specified in their certificates of registry or other national papers to the same extent and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a New Zealand ship under the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952.

This order replaces the Shipping Tonnage Order 1969, the only difference being the addition to the Schedule of Brazil, Liberia, Panama, and Senegal.
