THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Sales Tax Act, 1932-33, and the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Sales Tax Regulations 1933, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Sales Tax Regulations 1933* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on 1st day of December, 1950.

2. Regulation 32 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (a) of subclause (1) the words "a charge of 2s. 6d. per hour or any portion of an hour", and substituting the words "a charge of 5s. per hour or portion of an hour".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*]

These regulations increase from 2s. 6d. to 5s. an hour the charge for an officer's time spent in examining goods for the purposes of a drawback of sales tax.
