HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Department of Social Welfare Act 1971, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Work Bursaries Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Social Work Bursaries Regulations 1976* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1983.

2. Application of regulations—(1) These regulations shall apply in respect of social work bursaries awarded for a term commencing on and after the 1st day of January 1983. (2) In respect of every social work bursary awarded for a term

(2) In respect of every social work bursary awarded for a term commencing before that date and extended for a term commencing on or after that date the principal regulations shall continue to apply as if these regulations had not been made.

3. Increasing value of bursary-Regulation 5(1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression "\$315", and substituting the expression "\$700".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1983, increase the annual value of social work bursaries from \$315 to \$700. The increase will apply only to bursaries first awarded for a term commencing on or after 1

January 1983.
