**ORDER**

**1. Title**—This order may be cited as the Transport Amendment Act 1997 Commencement Order 1997.

**2. Commencement of section 3 of Transport Amendment Act 1997**—Section 3 of the Transport Amendment Act 1997 comes into force on 1 September 1997.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order brings into force on 1 September 1997 section 3 of the Transport Amendment Act 1997.

That section amends the definition of “stationary vehicle offence” in section 41A of the Transport Act 1962 to remove cross-references to specific regulations and allow the regulations themselves to specify just which offences are stationary vehicle offences.
