**THE TRADE AGREEMENT (AUSTRALIA) ORDER 1938.**

GALWAY, Governor-General.

**ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 26th day of February, 1938.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, and subsection (2) of section 2 of the Trade Agreement (New Zealand and Australia) Ratification Act, 1933, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and for the purpose of giving effect to an agreement modifying the Trade Agreement between the Commonwealth of Australia and the Dominion of New Zealand ratified by the Trade Agreement (New Zealand and Australia) Ratification Act, 1933, a modification of which was given effect to by Order in Council made on the 29th day of May, 1935,\* doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trade Agreement (Australia) Order 1938.

2. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of March, 1938.

3. The Order in Council made on the 29th day of May, 1935,\* respecting Customs duties chargeable on certain goods produced or manufactured in the Commonwealth of Australia is hereby revoked.

4. The existing Tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1934, with the alterations thereof referred to in section 6 of that Act and set out in Schedule B of the Appendix to the Trade Agreement (New Zealand and Australia) Ratification Act, 1933) is hereby suspended in so far as it relates to (a) the goods set out in the said Schedule B, and (b) the goods set out in the First Schedule hereto, being (in both cases) the produce or manufacture of the Commonwealth of Australia.

5. The duties set forth in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed, and the exemptions from duty set out therein are hereby created.

6. Every application of duties hereby effected and every exemption from duty hereby created shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act, 1913.

7. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable, and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred prior to the coming into force of this Order, shall be recovered and enforced as if this Order had not been made.

8. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the provisions of section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1931, in respect of the imposition of primage duty on any goods affected by this Order.

9. The provisions of this Order shall have effect, notwithstanding anything contained in the Customs Tariff Amendment Order 1938, No. 1,\* and the Customs Tariff Amendment Order 1938, No. 2.†
