ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 12th day of
November 1952

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL
PURSUANT to section 5 of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade
Act 1948, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting
by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby
makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Trade Arrangement
(Switzerland) Order 1952.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 14th day of November
1952.

2. The duties provided for by the General Agreement on Tariffs
and Trade Act 1948 in accordance with Part I of Schedule XIII to
the general agreement are hereby applied to similar goods, of the classes
set out in the Schedule hereto, being the produce or manufacture of
Switzerland.

3. The provisions of this order shall be subject to the provisions of
section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*]

This order extends to the products of Switzerland most-favoured-nation tariff treatment in respect of goods included in tariff item 342.
