PURSUANT to section 9 of the Tariff Act 1988, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Tariff (Concession) Amendment Order 1997.
- (2) This order comes into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- **2. Revocation of concession**—Part II of the Tariff is amended by revoking reference number 65 (as substituted by clause 2 of the Tariff (Concessions) Amendment Order 1996) and the description of the class of goods and rates of duty specified for that reference number.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force 28 days after its notification in the Gazette, revokes concession reference number 65 in Part II of the Tariff. That concession currently allows imports under approved tariff items from Brunei, Hong Kong, and Singapore to enter New Zealand at the less developed country (LDC) preferential duty rates set out in Part I of the Tariff.
