Pursuant to section 5 of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Trade Arrangement (Switzerland) Order (No. 2) 1955.
 - (2) This order shall come into force on the 9th day of September 1955.
- 2. The duties provided for by the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948 in accordance with Part I of Schedule XIII to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (as set out in the First Schedule to that Act) are hereby applied to similar goods, of the classes set out in the Schedule hereto, being the produce or manufacture of Switzerland.
- 3. The provisions of this order shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.

GOODS TO WHICH THE MOST FAVOURED NATION TARIFF APPLIES

Tariff Item No.	Description of Products
182	Textile piece goods—viz., dress nets, curtain nets, embroidery nets, and similar nets, lace curtain material, and veilings, all kinds; also fabrics of a like kind as may be determined by the Minister.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.] This order extends to the products of Switzerland most-favoured-nation Tariff treatment in respect of goods included in the above-mentioned tariff item.

The order is an extension of the three orders already in force in relation to Switzerland, namely:

The Trade Arrangement (Switzerland) Order 1948 (S.R. 1948/114); The Trade Arrangement (Switzerland) Order 1952 (S.R. 1952/200); and The Trade Arrangement (Switzerland) Order 1955 (S.R. 1955/100).
